The best way to do this is first to make a list of every skill you can confidently perform. This may be social skills, such as good at making conversation or always being willing to help others. Perhaps you have good analytical skills; you can easily pick out mistakes in a spreadsheet or problem-solve issues that come up in day-to-day life. Maybe you have great memory or directional skills. Any skill you can think of can be applied to certain jobs, which is a great way to narrow your job search.
